




Garden elements for winter

BIG garden elements



















Walls and steps define a slope

They show unless the snow is VERY deep




























Pair up to create texture contrasts

Prunus cistena with Spirea bumalda
































Astilbe Chrysanthemum Echinacea

Calamagrostis: Feather reed grass Helictrotricon...Blue oat grass























